# Lywphoma and CLL pharmaceutical updates

Please see below the results and updates from the March 2021 Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (PBAC) meetings.

Drug name and sponsor	Subtype	Listing requested and purpose	PBAC outcome
Brentuximab Vedotin (Takeda)	T-cell lymphoma	To request PBS listing for first line treatment of CD30 positive peripheral T-cell lymphoma (PTCL).	PBAC recommended the PBS listing of BV for use in combination with cyclophosphamide, doxorubicin, and prednisolone (CHP) for the treatment of patients with previously untreated CD30 positive PTCL. BV-CHP was clinically more superior that CHOP.

Change to listing	Acalabrutinib (AstraZeneca)	Relapsed and/or refractory mantle cell lymphoma (R/R MCL)	To request an Authority Required listing for the treatment of patients with R/R MCL who have received at least one prior therapy or who have developed an intolerance to another Bruton's tyrosine kinase (BTK) inhibitor.
New listing	Selinexor (Antengene)	Relapsed and/or refractory diffuse large B-cell lymphoma (DLBCL)	To request a Section 100 (Highly Specialised Drugs Program), Authority Required listing for the treatment of relapsed and/or refractory DLBCL in patients who have received at least two lines of systemic therapy.
New listing	Zanubrutinib (BeiGene)	Waldenstrom's macroglobulinaemia	To request a General Schedule, Authority Required (telephone) listing for the treatment of adult patients with Waldenstrom's macroglobulinemia
New listing	Zanubrutinib (BeiGene)	Relapsed and/or refractory mantle cell lymphoma	To request a General Schedule, Authority Required (telephone) listing for the treatment of relapsed and/or refractory mantle cell lymphoma.

# Commercial CAR T-cell therapy is now manufactured in Australia

Australian blood cancer patients including those with eligible subtypes of lymphoma and CLL will benefit with a breakthrough CAR T-cell therapy now to be made in Australia for the first time, within the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre.

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has granted approval for Cell Therapies Pty Ltd to commence commercial manufacturing of Kymriah®, a chimeric antigen receptor T-cell therapy (CAR-T) one-time treatment, in its manufacturing facility, which is located within the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre in Melbourne, Australia.

The approval makes Cell Therapies the first and only approved commercial manufacturing site for CAR-T in Australia for both clinical trial and non-clinical trial patients. Cell Therapies has been engaged in CAR-T development and clinical trial manufacturing for clinical investigators and other clients for over 10 years.

Kymriah® was the first CAR-T therapy to be approved by the TGA and publicly funded in Australia, for the treatment of eligible adult patients with relapsed or refractory DLBCL (diffuse large B cell lymphoma) and eligible paediatric and young adult patients up to 25 years of age with relapsed or refractory ALL (acute lymphoblastic leukaemia).

The Kymriah® manufacturing process is highly complex and requires several carefully performed steps. The patient's cells are first extracted then reprogrammed in the manufacturing facility and returned as a personalised, one-time treatment for infusion back into the patient.

Until now this advanced manufacturing process was conducted either in the Novartis Morris Plains facility in New Jersey, USA, or another approved overseas facility. Final approvals have now been received allowing Cell Therapies Pty Ltd, which operates a state-of-the-art facility within Peter Mac, to manufacture this treatment in Victoria.

"This is great news for Australian Lymphoma patients who may benefit from this potentially lifesaving treatment", said Lymphoma Australia Board Chairman, Serg Duchini.

The sites around Australia that now provide commercial CAR T-cell therapy for adult lymphoma/CLL includes Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre (Melbourne), Royal Prince Alfred Hospital (Sydney), Royal Brisbane & Women's Hospital (Brisbane) & Fiona Stanley Hospital (Perth).
